

How does the SU work with Sports clubs


SU

The SU & ALS work together but we are separate organisations

Have ownership of student groups they sit within the SU constitution We have overall responsibility for our clubs

Oversight of all student group activity - from regular activity, and implementing the processes to aid delivery of your events, governance, finances, elections and training

Manage fixtures & competition entries



Facilities

- On campus facilities are managed by ALS
- SU and ALS work together on training allocation
- When using the facilities:
 - Sign in on entry
 - Be respectful
 - Make bookings via SU



Training Facility Allocation: Process

- Facility allocation is determined by ALS each year based on a number of factors
- ALS + Student Opportunities work together to allocate this fairly
- Clubs will receive their training allocation in July

Training Facility Allocation: Principles

- Clear principles that is fair and consistent across all clubs
- There is no opportunity for changes or negotiation
- This applies to term one and term two only.

Members	Sessions Allocated
0-40	1
40-80	2
80+	3

Fixtures Facility Allocation

- Clubs will be guaranteed space (either allocated on campus or external facility space funded) for one team (or two teams if there is a men's and women's split).
- If space is not available after this, the cost of an external facility hire will need to be funded by the club.
- New teams entered into 23/24 will have to cover external facility hire

External Facilities

- Facilities we use regularly where we don't have space on campus e.g. Strodes, ACS, Egham Orbit
- Specialist facilities that do not exist on campus e.g. swimming pool, golf courses, climbing wall etc.
- Annual H&S visits

Coaching

Coaching: Recruitment

- Over July/August
- How to recruit?
 - Network of contacts
 - Create a job description and advertise through BUCS
 - Check NGB for qualification requirements
- Form on Freshdesk
- Coaching for Captains



Coaching: Onboarding

- Must be done on an annual basis
- Contract for services
- Car registration
- Committee and coach must complete registration form by 1 September
- Coaching code of conduct




Coaching: Things to think about

- If your NGB states you must have a coach, you will not be able to commence training until you have a coach in place
- If you have had a coach for a long time: still check you're getting good value for money.
- Concerned about a coach or need to have a challenging conversation: we can support

Fixture Management

BUCS

- Organisation managed by the SU
- Medic cover provided by the SU
- Facilities managed by ALS

LUSL

- Organisation managed by captains
- SU must still be informed space must still be booked
- Captains must be first aid trained
- Last minute cancellations
- Facilities managed by ALS

# of Members	Funding provided
0-40	Up to £200 / 1 BUCS + 1 LUSL OR 2 BUCS OR 2 LUSL
41-80	Up to £300 / 2 BUCS + 1 LUSL OR 3 BUCS OR 3 LUSL
80+	Up to £400 / 2 BUCS + 2 LUSL OR 4 BUCS OR 4 LUSL

Minimum Operating Standards

- Introducing Minimum Operating standards
- Must be met in order to operate, train & compete
- In conjunction with ALS to ensure your clubs are operating safely
- We will provide each club a document detailing key safety requirements set out by NGB's

- Attend first aid training

 - Check insurance and qualifications
- Complete general risk assessment




